

# Sweet peas for pure bliss



Pink sweet peas (for blissful pleasure) are Christine Coleman's April flower of the month. Flat-back rhinestones represent diamond birthstones.

## TRACE

With white pencil - fold line and edge of card; Daler Rowney Pearlescent Pink - shapes in four corners; Fuchsia Tinta ink - writing.

## COLOUR

The Sweet Peas are worked with Faber Castell Polychromos pencils in colours of your choice. I used Dark Red (225), Middle purple pink (125), Pink Madder Lake (129), Moss Green (168), Light Green (171) and Cream (102).

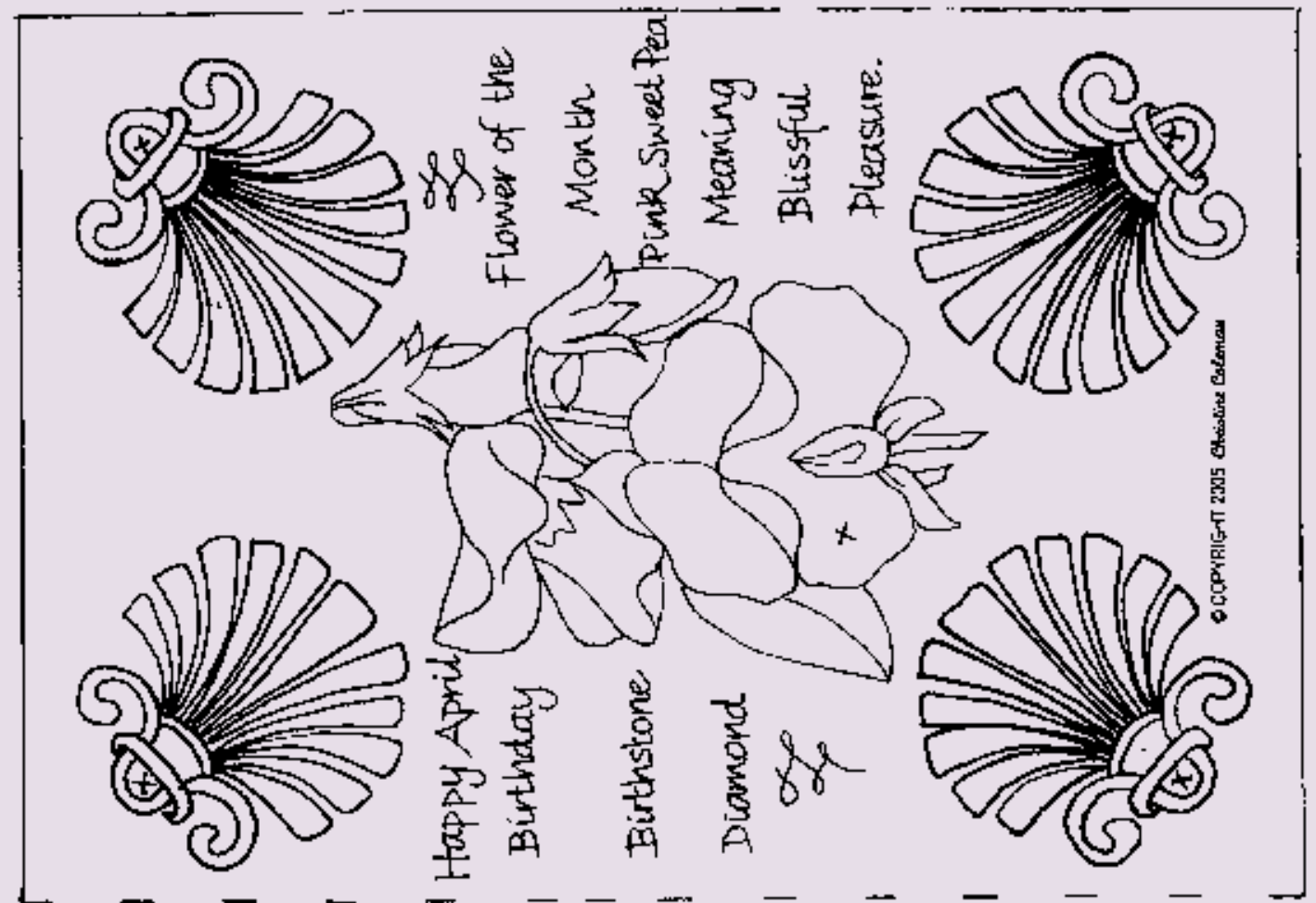
Starting with the darkest colour work in fine strokes, blending in the next colour and ending with white highlights. Do the same with the leaves but use cream as the highlight.

## EMBOSS

Very little embossing is needed on the sweet peas but you can use a scribe or stylus to lightly emboss the highlighted areas. Emboss the corner shapes in the usual way and use a ruler and medium-ball tool to emboss the card outline.

## FINISHING

Cut card and insert to size (I used Rainbow card) and sew together. Stick on the flat-back rhinestones where marked with an X on pattern.
